## Foreword by USSSA Commissioner PES



Ladies and Gentlemen, Esteemed members of the Uganda Secondary School Sports Association, ASSHU and distinguished Guests.

It is an honor to address you today at the 42nd Annual General Meeting, where we come together to discuss the vital role of sports in our schools and communities. As the Commissioner for Physical Education and Sports, I want to highlight the legal provisions for sports participation in schools and their implications for our young athletes. The Education Act 2008: Governs the provision of education in Uganda, including physical education. It mandates the inclusion of physical education in school curricula, promoting sports as part of holistic education. Ensures that all students participate in physical education, fostering a culture of sports from a young age. I am glad to note that the first cohort of the Secondary Schools Physical Education sat for UCE in 2024. This is a move in the right direction and the Ministry encourages you all to contribute in your various capacities towards effective implementation of the Secondary School Physical Education Curriculum.

**The National Sports Act (2023):** This repealed the NCS Act (1964). This act provides for the development, management,

and regulation of sports in Uganda. It establishes the National Council of Sports, mandates the registration of Mono- sports organizations, and outlines the roles and responsibilities of sports bodies. The Act encourages the inclusion of sports in educational institutions, ensuring that students have access to organized sports activities and facilities. The Multi-Sports Educational Institutions Organizations like USSSA, UPSSA among others implement delegated functions of Department of Physical Education and Sports and are bound by the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Education and Sports from time to time for good of the learners under their care. The National Physical Education and Sports Policy (2023): This policy aimed at promoting Physical Education and sports development and participation. It provides initiatives for talent identification, sports funding, and infrastructure development. The policy among other objectives enhances opportunities for students to engage in sports through improved facilities, funding, and talent development programs. All the achievements USSSA presents in this report complements the Ministry's efforts in achieving the Policy strategic objectives.

**Uganda Olympic Committee (UOC) Regulations:** Regulates the participation of Ugandan athletes in international Olympic sports competitions. It sets standards for athlete selection, training, and participation in events like the Olympics, and the All-Africa Games. The Regulations provide pathways for talented student-athletes to compete at higher levels, including international competitions. Secondary schools sports provide the transitional stage from amateur to elite sports and the earlier you acquaint yourselves and learners with regulations that govern sports participation at elite level the better.

**The USSSA General Rules and Regulations:** These are updated from time to time based on practices on ground and to provide the most suitable guidelines and a levelled ground for Secondary schools' sports competitions at all levels. These are your own regulations and you should champion at every level of sports competitions for the good of the sport. You

should also provide feedback on areas that need revision with the view of improving them.

At international level, sports specific rules and regulations exist within which we should practice the various sports disciplines.

**The World Anti-Doping Agency:** Anti-doping codes provide list of prohibited substance and doping procedures which we must acquaint ourselves with and be able to guide the learners and coaches appropriately. Use of performance enhancement substances is prohibited globally. As Ministry of Education and Sports energy drinks for learners participating in sports to boost their energy are prohibited. The Ministry of Education and Sports will come up with several standards and guidelines and Statutory Instruments to implement the National Physical Education and Sports Policy (2023) and National Sports Act (2023). Be ready to contribute when consulted.

I therefore urge all stakeholders to recognize the importance of the above mentioned robust legal frameworks that support and protect sports participation in schools. Laws and regulations provide the necessary guidelines to ensure safety and welfare of players; cater for inclusivity by providing equal opportunities to all learners; foster fairness and protection of the rights of young athletes; ensure compliance and accountability from every stakeholder in sports; and most importantly provide synergy for collaboration among all stakeholders.

Thank you USSSA, ASSHU, parents, all National Sports Federations and Associations, students, and all sports lovers, for the successful 2024 sports season. Your contributions are invaluable. God Bless you all.

Key Highlights

## Enhanced Competitions:

The president reported on the progress made in enhancing competitions. The focus has been on mass sports to provide more opportunities for students to showcase their talents and develop their skills.

Age-category competitions have been emphasized to ensure fair play and proper development of young athletes.

## Achievements:

Several students who participated in national and international competitions have been recognized for their achievements. Notably, some students have been invited to join professional teams in the UK.

The association has trained 6,500 students and teachers in various areas, including coaching, refereeing, and media.

## Infrastructure Development:

The government has supported the upgrading of sports

and boarding facilities in schools. This will enable the hosting of national and international competitions in top-notch venues.

Private schools have also invested in infrastructure, with some promising to build first-class facilities, including stadiums and swimming pools.

## Marketing and Sponsorship:

Efforts made to promote the USSSA brand and attract partners and sponsors. Fresh Dairy and Stanbic Bank are among the sponsors who were on board.

An annual award ceremony was approved to recognize outstanding contributions from school administrators and athletes.

## Administration and Registration:

The association had improved its secretarial functions and advocated for the placement of sports teachers and head teachers in sporting schools.

Online registration for students had been introduced to regulate player movement and prevent cheating.

## Unified Approach:

The association has worked to unify primary and secondary school sports associations into a single cohesive body. This consolidation has strengthened their collective voice and efforts.

## Effective Communication:

Communication efforts improved, ensuring accurate information dissemination both internally and externally. The creation of a marketing and communication directorate and the acquisition of technology for live streaming and broadcasting have enhanced visibility.

The USSSA AGM 2023 highlighted significant progress in school sports, with enhanced competitions, infrastructure development, and effective communication. The association remains committed to the well-being and development of students, aiming to inspire, empower, and nurture young athletes.

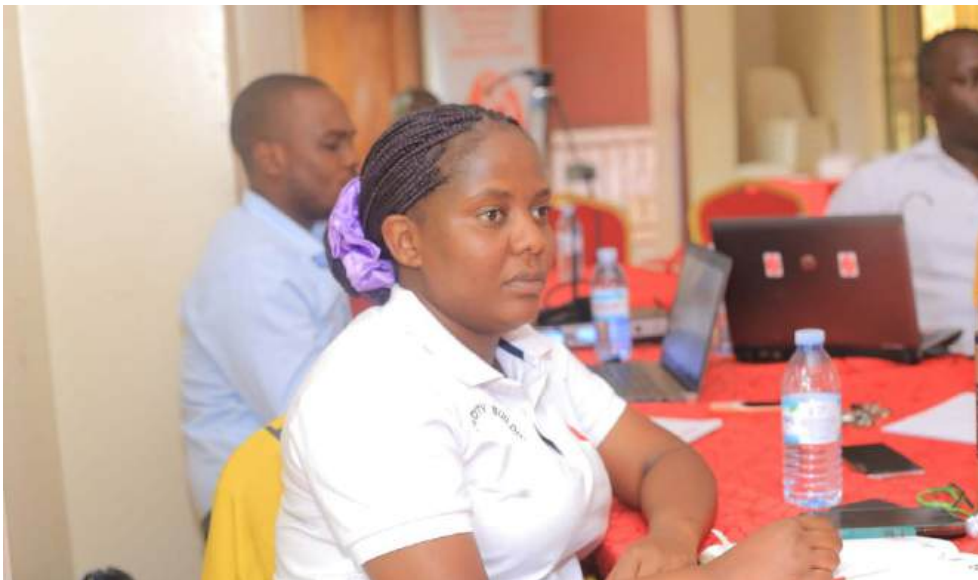

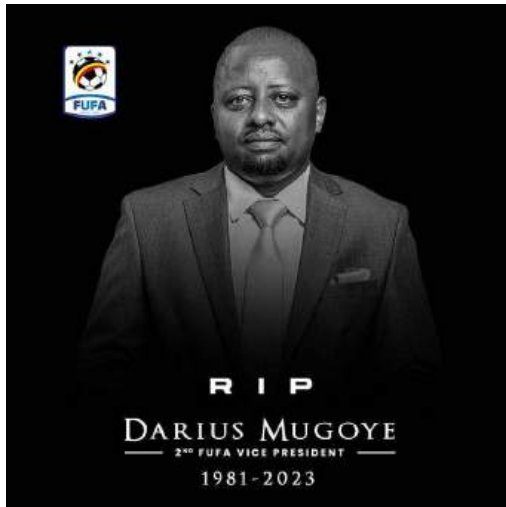

# MARKETING, COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

For USSSA's broader activities, the organization has embraced extensive media engagement to reach audiences nationwide. Through partnerships with key TV stations and active streaming platforms, USSSA ensures that live matches, press briefs, press conferences, and organizational meetings are broadcast to keep supporters, athletes, and the public informed and connected. # Information Technology Systems and Infrastructure

## Overview

As USSSA, we have implemented robust Information Technology (IT) systems and infrastructure to enhance efficiency, streamline operations, and ensure seamless execution of its activities. These efforts encompass the scoping, design, development, and maintenance of IT systems, equipment, and software, alongside staff training for their effective use.

## Key IT Systems

### 1. School Registration and Students Management System (Secondary)

Objective: To register all schools and athletes participating in USSSA activities, facilitate enrollment in championships, and manage data for improved organization and preparation.

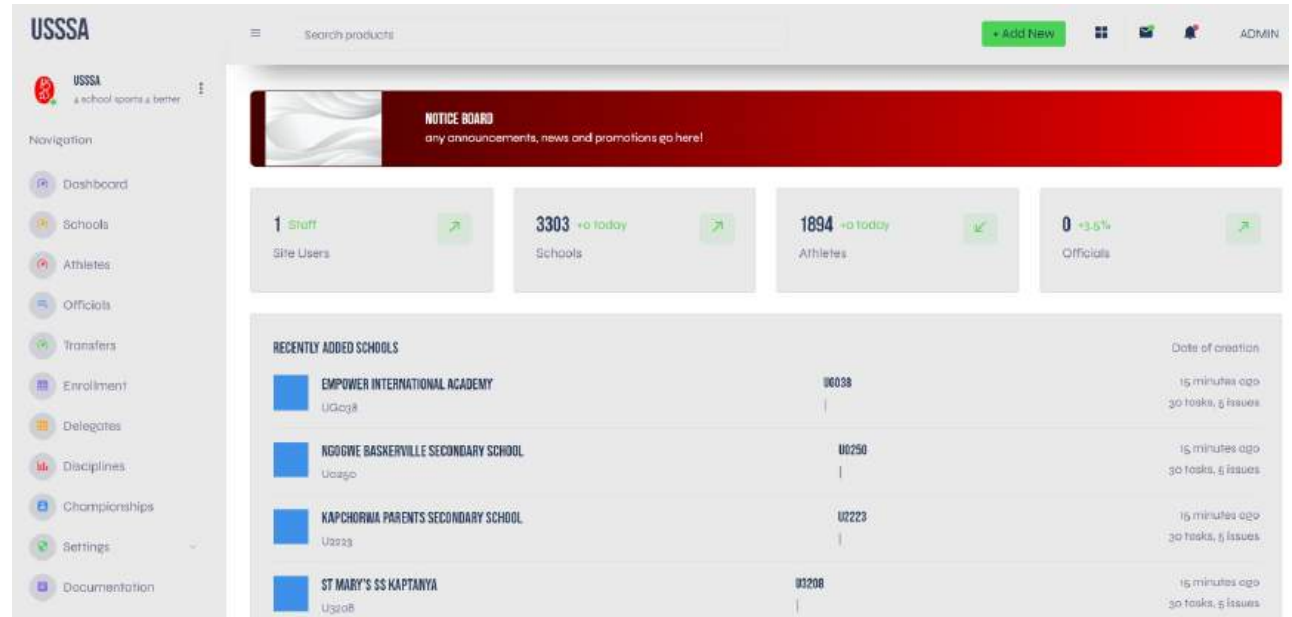

**Technologies:** Python Django, JQuery, MySQL, Apache, REDIS

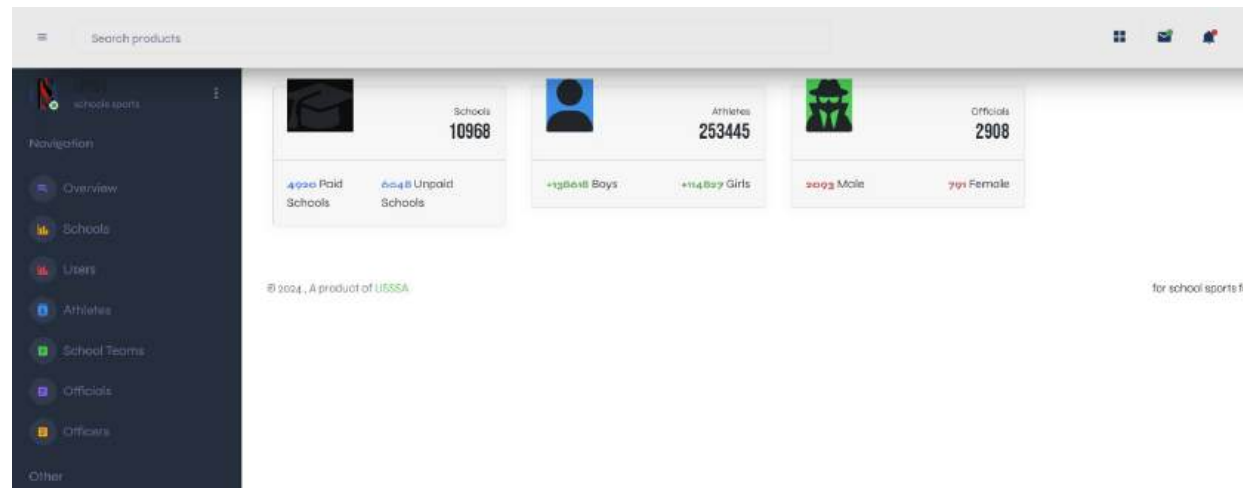
**Integration:** Plans for API integration with the Competition Management System (CMS) for seamless data transfer.

**Impact:** An upgrade of the previous system, introducing features like foreign student registration, athlete sport interest tracking, in-house payment capabilities, and improved accountability.



### School Registration and Students Management System (Primary)

Objective: Similar to the secondary system, this system facilitates the registration of schools and athletes, ensuring proper organization for primary school championships.



**Key Features:**

- Student and school registration
- Data integrity measures and reporting tools
- Enrollment and payment management
- Technologies: Python Django, JQuery, MySQL, Apache, REDIS

Integration: Future API integration with the CMS.

Impact: Streamlined primary school games, ensuring eligibility and age compliance. To date, over 253,000 athletes from 10,300 schools have been registered.

**3. Competition Management System (CMS)**

Objective: To simplify tournament organization, including fixture creation, scheduling, and results management, while providing live updates for stakeholders.

**Key Features:**

- Monitoring of athlete and team performance
- Event scheduling and management
- Transfer management between schools
- Reporting tools (event results, participation stats)

- Integration with external data sources

Technologies: Python Django, JQuery, MySQL, Apache, REDIS

Impact: Real-time updates and streamlined championship management.

**IT Equipment and Training**

USSSA has invested in the following equipment:

Devices: Laptops, printers, scanners, binders, routers, and accessories.

Software: Tools for efficient operations and data management.

Training: Comprehensive staff training programs on equipment usage and system maintenance to enhance operational effectiveness.

**Achievements and Future Prospects**

Enhanced data management for over 253,000 athletes across primary and secondary schools.

Streamlined enrollment, payment processing, and championship organization.

Plans to integrate systems via APIs for improved data flow and analytics.

USSSA's investment in IT systems and infrastructure has revolutionized the management of school sports. These advancements position USSSA as a leader in leveraging technology for the development of sports in Uganda.

**MEDIA**

In an effort to foster a closer and more productive relationship with the Uganda Sports Press Association (USPA), the Uganda School Sports Association (USSSA) held a collaborative workshop designed to address critical issues surrounding media coverage of school sports in Uganda.

A total of 75 journalists attended the event that was held at Kati Kati restaurant in December 2023.

This was a way to ensure that several media stakeholders understood what USSSA activities entail.

There have been several press conferences over the year and journalists have attended these in big numbers whenever called upon.

This year we have liaised with Editors of newspapers New Vision and Daily Monitor and TV Producers of NTV, NBS TV, BBS TV, TV West and BABA TV stations for a wider coverage of all our press conferences and championships than ever before.

Inclusion of more reporters and radio presenters has helped make informed adjustments making sure the objectives of the association are met.

Live coverage of events has continued throughout the year 2024. All USSSA championships have been broadcast live across the USSSA YouTube channel in addition to Tv stations such as FUFA TV, TV WEST and Baba TV.

## CAF AFRICAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIP

Uganda was proudly represented at the CAF African Schools Football Championship by St. Mary's Kitende (boys) and Kawempe Muslim SS (girls), with the delegation led by USSSA EXCOM member Hajji Hussein Lwebawo Kyagulanyi. The tournament brought to life remarkable talent and courage, especially from Kawempe Muslim SS, who made an impressive debut.

### Kawempe Muslim SS (Girls)

Kawempe dominated Group B, finishing unbeaten with seven points. They drew 1-1 with South Africa, and secured consecutive 2-0 victories against Togo and Gambia, earning a spot in the semi-finals. Despite their title hopes ending with a narrow 1-0 loss to Morocco in the semi-finals, Kawempe bounced back to claim bronze in the third-place playoff against Tanzania, winning 1-0 thanks to a decisive second-half goal by Cynthia Kirenga.

Shadia Nabirye emerged as a standout player, scoring

three goals in five matches and earning the tournament's Top Scorer award. Kawempe's efforts were rewarded with \$150,000 in prize money, highlighting their exceptional performance and resilience throughout the championship.

### St. Mary's Kitende (Boys)

St. Mary's Kitende had a challenging run in the tournament, failing to score in their two matches. They lost their opener 1-0 to Tanzania and drew 0-0 with Senegal, finishing with one point and missing out on the knockout stages.

### Celebration

The Uganda delegation celebrated their achievements with a luncheon hosted at Imperial Royale Hotel, recognizing the teams' efforts and commitment. Kawempe Muslim SS's bronze medal and individual accolades, particularly Shadia Nabirye's top-scoring performance, underscored Uganda's growing presence in African school football.

## THE OPENING CEREMONY

Since its inception in 1996, the Federation of East Africa School Sports Association (FEASSA) has championed sports excellence and unity across the region. The 2024 FEASSA Games, hosted by Bukedea Comprehensive School and co-hosted by Amus College School in Uganda, marked a historic milestone in the event's legacy.

For the first time, the Games were inaugurated by a sitting head of state. President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni officially opened the event at the newly constructed Bukedea Comprehensive Sports Complex, emphasizing the national importance of youth sports. Accompanied by dignitaries such as Speaker of Parliament Anita Annet Among, State Minister for Sports Peter Ogwang, and FEASSA/USSSA President Justus Mugisha, President Museveni ceremonially kicked the Zakayo Ball and raised the Ugandan flag to launch the Games.

Uganda, a proud FEASSA host nation since 2003, has held the Games in various cities, including Kampala, Mbarara, Fort Portal, Lira, Gulu, and now Bukedea. Each event has strengthened regional ties and nurtured talent, with the 2024 Games standing out as a significant moment in FEASSA's history, reaffirming Uganda's commitment to youth sports and East African unity. # **INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENTS**

## ISF FOOTBALL WORLD CUP- DALIAN, CHINA.

The 2024 ISF Football World Cup in Dalian, China, was a memorable event for Uganda, with two Ugandan teams earning medals on the international stage. This marked Uganda's second appearance at the ISF World Cup, following its debut in 2023 in Morocco with teams from Amus College, Kibuli SS, and St. Noa Girls.

In 2024, Uganda was represented by Bukedea Comprehensive School, Amus College School (both boys and girls teams), and St. Mary's College Kisubi. The Ugandan delegation of 104 included athletes, officials from the Ministry of Education and Sports, USSSA representatives, and four referees. The delegation was led by the State Minister for Sports, Hon. Peter Ogwang, and Mr. Patrick Okanya, President Emeritus of USSSA.

Running from May 17 to May 26, the tournament saw Uganda's teams perform exceptionally:

Amus College School (Uganda 1) won silver after a thrilling 2-2 draw against China 2 in the final, ultimately losing 5-3 in a penalty shootout at Suoyuwan Stadium.

Bukedea Comprehensive School (Uganda 2) secured bronze with

a victory over China 2 in the third-place playoff.

St. Mary's College Kisubi (Uganda 3) finished 31st out of 36 teams, concluding their run with a 7-3 win over India.

The Amus College School girls' team placed 8th out of 19 teams, with star player Edna Wanda claiming the tournament's Golden Boot with an impressive 17 goals.

Additionally, Uganda's four referees – Makanga Hazahal, Tony Kalairowo, Lydia Auma, and Barbra Nayebare – were selected to officiate in several matches, including a game between Morocco and China 3. Makanga Hazahal, a graduate of the USSSA Capacity Building and Training Program, proudly represented Uganda as part of the officiating team.

The World Cup was a significant achievement for Uganda, as the teams not only brought home silver and bronze medals but also demonstrated the country's growing talent on the global school football stage.

### Boys’ Team Performance

Victories over Brazil (45-41), Chile 2 (78-31), China II (66-43), and the Czech Republic (80-44).

Close Losses to Mongolia (51-50) and Serbia (60-58).

Walkover Win against Mongolia in the final classification round, as Mongolia had departed the tournament early.

This performance placed the boys’ team in 11th position, demonstrating their skill and resilience in international competition.

### Girls’ Team Performance

The girls’ team delivered a solid effort, securing two wins against India and Cyprus, finishing 12th overall. Despite facing tough competition, the team’s

performance was commendable and showcased Uganda’s growing strength in school basketball.

Upon their return, the boys’ team was warmly received at Entebbe International Airport by Uganda Secondary Schools Sports Association (USSSA) Vice President Hajji Twahil Kitezeela, along with the team captain, Matthew Kisakye. The welcome underscored the pride Uganda holds in its young athletes and their international achievements.

### Looking Ahead

Following this international outing, the teams will shift focus to the upcoming USSSA Ball Games II, scheduled for July 9 to 17 at Teso College Aloit. These games will serve as qualifiers for Uganda’s representation at the 2024 FEASSSA Games, set to be co-hosted by Bukedea Comprehensive School and Amus College in August.

### Conclusion

Uganda’s performance at the ISF Basketball Championship in Macau has bolstered the nation’s presence on the international stage, highlighting the talent and dedication of our young athletes. Both the boys’ and girls’ teams displayed skill, resilience, and the potential to advance even further in future tournaments.

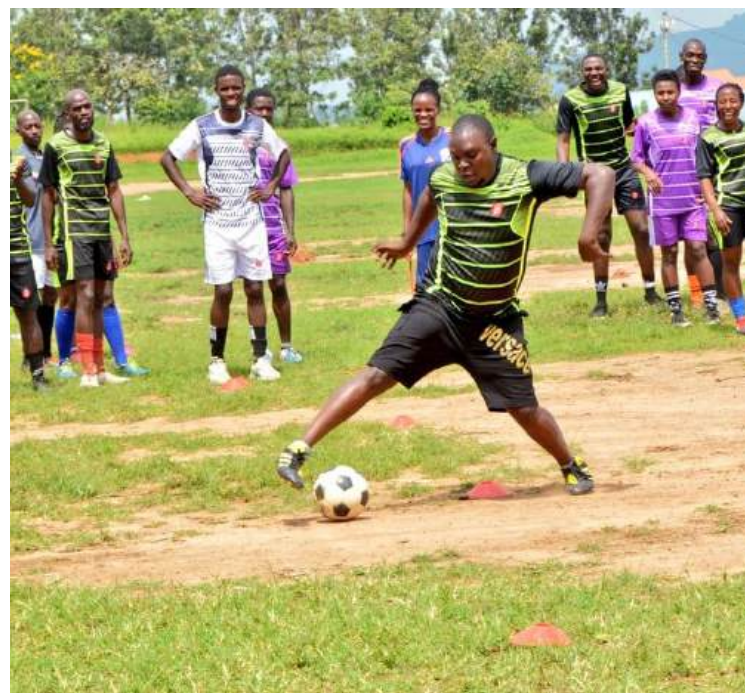

4. Create man power for mass sports

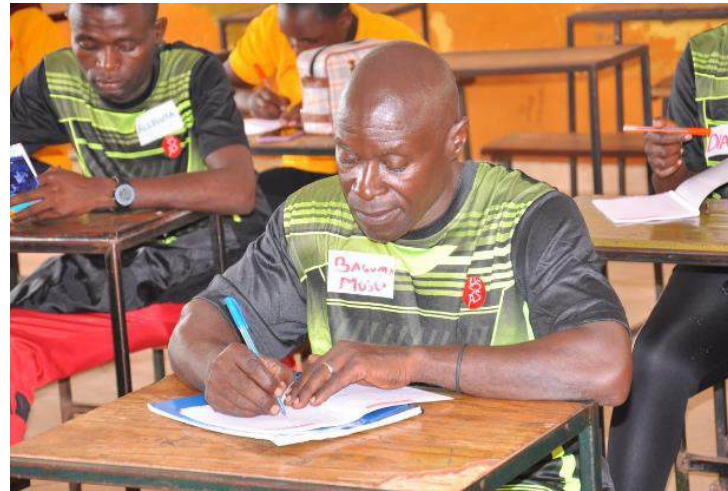




To this date, we have trained up to 11,485 participants who have helped to shape the landscape of schools sports.
